From the formation of the ground rules of this great organization we defy the common notion that Nigerians cannot plan and succeed together. Prior to and around 1990, the existing Nigerian organizations could not withstand the challenges posed by the rules of "collective goals."

The fact that some of the early members of this organization have been close associates of the members of the few Nigerian organizations existing prior to 1990; they have had clear understanding of the difficulty of forming and sustaining an organization. The founding members did not allow skepticism to stop the vision to re-energize the forgotten and deprived group, the Osun people. I took a first step to consult with the few Osun indigenes that I knew. I almost gave up but later found that few families have had negative experience few years back about forming an Osun organization. The next step was to find out why it failed. I interviewed those who were major players in the former Osun group. My deduction was that their missions, though broad, might not have been flexible enough to achieve their visions.

The next challenge was to search for like minds. In the Osun communities, like minds for progress was not far fetched. I was directed to my brother, Pastor Adeyemi, who was able to introduce his friend, Mr. Animasahun. The organization started with the first three members in February 3, 1990.
